

COMMODORE'S UPDATE

The Management Committee is considering a number of opportunities and projects to benefit Club Members, now and in the future. Completion of the Western Extension project is near and it is very pleasing to see that it will provide additional "day use" vehicle/trailer parking and also hardstand storage space.

That project will benefit Members but we also need to be aware that it will take a bit more time to get to and from these spaces after launching or when retrieving watercraft and therefore, some delays may be seen at the jetties from time to time. We cannot provide scooters or ask Members to run to and from the new parking/storage spaces but we are considering the extension of jetties to alleviate the anticipated occasional congestion. Please be patient with other Members and if your vehicle/trailer has to be retrieved from the new parking/storage areas or the original hardstand compound, think about letting others on or around the jetties know that you will return as quickly as possible.

Updating and amending various Rules and Policies remains an ongoing task. With the completion of the Western Extension and the possibility of additional wet Pens in the future, we need to review such documents to ensure we continue to manage the safety of Members, property and equipment those changes and additions around the Club may bring about.

In recent times we have introduced a new requirement in the form of our Fire and Safety Compliance Policy and Procedure (Pens). We have focused on its introduction and uptake with existing wet Pen occupants where certification of watercraft by the end of June 2021 has been promoted as a condition of having their watercraft in a wet Pen in the future.

Soon we will invite all Members to familiarise with this Policy and attain certification for their watercraft as a condition of temporary and occasional occupancy of a wet Pen at the Club. The Policy and associated Self Assessment Checklist are available to view or download from the Club Website (Downloads/Other Downloads). All Members who intend to use a wet Pen in the future are encouraged to participate and support this important safety initiative.

With watercraft now being stored in the Western Extension hardstand bays and day use bays also now available, it is timely to review existing safety requirements for parking in this and existing areas around the Club. One standout concern which has been observed and requires our immediate attention is the use of stones, rocks, sticks, blocks of wood, etc. as wheel chocks for trailers. Please be reminded that in most cases, when your tow vehicle is disconnected from your trailer, the brakes are not operable and are not applied. Members are encouraged to use suitably sized wedge shaped chocks made of plastic, rubber, wood, etc.. At least one axle should have one chock at the front of a wheel and another at the rear of a wheel.

Please ensure you have suitable wheel chocks to use if you store your watercraft at the Club or intend to leave your watercraft on its trailer in the grounds and disconnected from your tow vehicle.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The office has been very busy over the past two months with new Membership and accommodation enquiries together with Membership, hardstand boat storage and pen storage renewals.

In addition to FOB access to our Main Entry Gate being discontinued at the end of March, automatic exit through ground sensors was also discontinued to enhance security. There have been minimal problems with these changes. A huge thank you to our Members who have been patient and supportive during the change-over.

Fish Cleaning Station Fence

A new 900 high Colorbond fence has been installed on the western and part northern side of the station to contain fish scales etc... from blowing into the recently extended western lease extension area. Our fencing contractor and Club Member Rick Fiddes from Prowest Fencing was responsible for erecting the fence.

Main Road to our Entry/Exit Gate

We are liaising with our landlord, Department of Transport to hopefully achieve a wider entry road and to restrict the public from blocking this important road.

Parking & Traffic Flow Map

We have recently updated the large "Parking & Traffic Flow" map to include the western lease extension and southern fence excision which has created several new parking bays.

Vehicle Parking Behind the Clubhouse

The location of car parking bays behind the clubhouse has changed following completion of the western lease extension. Please check the new parking and traffic flow signs inside the main gate and outside the eastern entry to Louise's Bar. All car bays are line marked in yellow.

Black Security Fencing

We have installed a combination of new and recycled powder coated panels on the new fence alignment north and south of the Main Entry Gates. Our sincere thanks to Mark Weise (CV Powder Coaters & Sponsor) and Rick Fiddes (Prowest Fencing) for their support with this project.

Membership Renewal Incentive

FIRE & SAFETY INFORMATION SESSIONS 9.30am Sat 10th July and 1pm Sunday 11th July

The Club has organised two Information Sessions to provide boat owners intending on using a temporary pen, to familiarise themselves with the new Fire & Safety Compliance Policy and Procedures necessary for pen occupancy (allocated and temporary). Allocated pen occupiers are well advanced in achieving compliance which will also be a pre-requisite for all temporary bookings from 1 November.

The Club has finalised its Fire & Safety Compliance Policy and Procedure (Pens) document with the objective of raising the level of awareness and attention to the risks of fire and injury on our watercraft, which will also protect fellow Member's watercraft and Club marina infrastructure. The process is in line with best practice and is consistent with the policy and procedures used at responsible boat clubs and marinas.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The June 2021 Quarter has seen the Financial and Management Committee working on the 2021/22 Budget and Strategic Planning agenda for the next two years and for the longer + 2 year horizons. As mentioned in my last March 2021 Report the Committee welcomed input from Members on these items for consideration and input into the discussions. Strategically the Committee looked at "stay in business" type of items as well as a "wish list" of possible ideas and some out of "left field" ideas. All of these will require future research and work to develop into Budget Plans but it does provide guidance so that approaches can be made to various bodies and opportunities progressed if they arise as items of interest to the future of the Club. One such past opportunity identified and developed through this process was the recently completed Western Extension of our grounds and hard standing and parking.

A great deal of work has also been done on the finalisation and approval of our 2021/2022 Budget. This was approved by the Management Committee at its May meeting, resulting in a very modest increase in Members subscriptions and associated fees at 2%, slightly above the Perth CPI increase of 1.1% (All Aust Capital Cities 2.3%). This, combined with a no increase in the previous year's fees due to Covid, is very much a result of prudent financial management. I'm sure members will appreciate the Club being able to minimise fee increases.

The other side of the ledger is in our costs, which have been contained again this year. This however will still result in us maintaining services and facilities to our current very high standards.

The budget has been structured to provide sufficient net surplus to achieve a similar positive cash flow to the current year to cover the Westpac Bank \$15,000 p/a sinking fund (Bank Guarantee facility), a \$126,000 p/a principal reduction of our bank loan and to partially fund a proposed near \$1 million capital expenditure program for the New Year. This will include Stage 3 of the Pen Development and sea wall/ additional parking facility.

We now are almost at the end of the 2020/2021 financial year with half a month remaining as I am writing this report. Results to the end of May 2021 are 20 % above (surplus) last YTD figures and are on track to maintain this at year end. This is a remarkable result given the uncertainty and hardships experienced by the world due to Covid - 19 illness, lockdowns and additional work load because of it. Your Club has been fortunate that the effects on it have not been as severe as expected this time last year. The club has had significant financial support from both Federal and State Government Departments by way of funding (\$52K), rent holidays and utility subsidies.

The Lock Downs fortunately had only a minor impact on Members' ability to continue to use launching facilities for recreational purposes and has had an upside in the increasing number of new Members joining boating for the first time and becoming Members to learn how to get the most out of their boating. A silver lining to uncertain times. Member numbers are up 33 overall this year including 19 Full Members as at May 2021. We have seen new members join throughout the year and have seen Member renewals strong so far following renewal notices having been sent out in May.

I encourage all Members to renew before 30 June to participate in the draw for a fabulous Furuno Sounder donated by our sponsor Taylor Marine. Win this and your fishing catch can only go up.

The recent bad weather had delayed the retrieval of the Perth FAD's (fish aggregating device) and with 4 still out at the trench a couple of boats decided to head out. The water out there was still 23 degrees and the Mahi were hungry with a fish biting at every pass.

Those fishing in closer were rewarded with a wide variety of species including Dhufish, Breaksea Cod, Snapper, Whiting and the every persistent Wrasse to name a few.

We were lucky to have some great support from the team at MADFISH with each of the category winners taking home a premium cooler bag and, prizes going to pretty much everyone who entered a fish.

FIRE & SAFETY COMPLIANCE

I am pleased to advise members that the Fire & Safety inspection of penned boats is progressing with around 50% of boats in occupied pens having been assessed, most with no-rectification work being required.

I would ask members that have NOT had their boats checked to please have this done as soon as possible, it is not a very onerous task & once you have your self assessment form completed, it takes about 15 to 30 minutes to go through the verification process.

As you would be aware those with boats having a 240v shore power supply require a Galvanic Isolator to be installed, if you have a 240v power supply to your boat & do not have one installed Bill Woodthorpe (alternate Fire & Safety Officer) has sourced a reasonably priced unit that can be ordered on-line for around \$140, if you are interested please contact Bill & he will pass on the details.

The Fire & Safety policy was recently amended to remove the requirement for an electrical certificate which greatly simplified compliance requirements, however if you have gas appliances installed you will require a current Gas Certificate.

Trailer boat owners that wish to occupy pens on a temporary basis will also need to have their boat Fire & Safety checked to ensure they comply with the Clubs Fire & Safety Policy before doing so.

I can also report that the Club has arranged for 2 Fire & Safety information sessions to answer any questions on this matter to be held on;

- Saturday 10th July at 9:30am
- Sunday 11th July at 1:00pm



ORIENTATION REPORT

BY BRENT FLETCHER - 2ND REAR COMMODORE

New Member orientations have continued pretty much every fortnight for the last few months. Lots of new Members signed up and getting to learn a bit about our Clubs' history and where it's going. One of the things we discuss in the inductions are some of the common mistakes our Members make, contrary to the Club Rules. A few of these are:

- Visitors park outside - If you have visitors coming to the Club, they don't get access to parking in the grounds. Parking is reserved for Members, who have paid for it.
- No riding in boats or trailer - We don't let anyone ride in boats, on trailers, on the back of Utes etc. There is a lot of vehicle movement around the club.
- No drive on/ off - You need to float and push your boat off to launch and then winch it back on. Drive on/off is dangerous, and can result in boat, ramp and jetty damage.
- Correct parking directions - Please don't use the bays marked XL unless you have to. For some Members, these are the only bays they can fit in. When you do park avoid blocking others and pick the right bay. Please don't stop in driveways, across parking bays or in no parking zones (even if it's just for a second for whatever reason).
- Club Identification - Make sure your 3 stickers are affixed and you have your Member card. Stickers go on the driver's side - window of your car, winch upright of the trailer, window or hull of the boat (that way we know where to look).
- Tailgating - If someone tries to follow you in, and you don't know them and can't see a club sticker, drive only as far forward as you need to and let the gate close. If they are a Member, they'll buzz in. We do get Non-Members trying to use the facilities for free.

Myself and other Members of the Committee are currently in the process of developing a scheme to increase club volunteering. Currently, we ask all new Members to get involved in two club events in their first year of membership. We are looking to a more formal scheme in the future. Stay tuned.

As always, if you are interested in learning a bit about the club, or brushing up on the Rules, come down to an orientation. The office can book you in. It takes about an hour and includes a tour of the club including what opens what, directions of travel, and etiquette.

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
