I also wish to recognise outgoing Committee members Rod Bonser and Bill Woodthorpe who over their years on the Committee have both been strong participants and have agreed to continue to volunteer to assist with fire and safety inspections. Thank you both. I also acknowledge the many years of combined roles to Des Kelly who has also stepped down from the Committee to enjoy more family time and to travel somewhat more. Thank you again Des.

Welcome to the new Committee members Malcolm Tull, Paul Chatterley, Peter Montague and also welcome back Past Commodore Mark Glew. We have recently had our first committee meeting which achieved a 100% turnout of all Committee members which was great to see.
