

### WEST COAST DEMERSAL REVIEW UPDATE

Members,

Firstly, thank you to all Members who took the time to provide a response to the original proposal presented by Fisheries. Whether you signed the E-petition or took time to write to your local Member or Ministers, every effort was valued. Thank you.

The CPBC committee is continuing to review the changes and is awaiting some further details to be released and clarifications on certain points. We will keep you advised of any further information in relation to these changes as they become available.

Below is summary of the rule changes to date.

On Tuesday 6/12/22 the Fisheries Minister released his statement on new measures to recover West Coast demersal Scalefish stocks.

These new rules will be introduced on 1st Feb 2023 and at this stage run to 2030 as for the Recreational sector it is made up of Primary and Supporting measures.

#### **Primary measures:**

- The current two-month demersal closure will be extended by four months for recreational fishers in the West Coast Bioregion from Kalbarri to Augusta.
- Catching demersal scalefish from a boat will be prohibited from:
  - 1 February to 31 March (inclusive)
  - 1 August to the beginning of the September/October school holidays;
  - And end of the September/October school holidays to 15 December (inclusive).

\*Note this does not apply to land based recreational line fishers who can fish all year round and different management rules will be used for fishing charters and commercial fishers.

#### Supporting measures:

- A boat limit of four demersal scalefish per vessel.
- A mixed-species daily bag limit of two demersal scalefish (except coral trout, coronation trout and western blue groper).
- The dhufish boat limit has been removed, so an individual angler can catch up to two dhufish.
- Removal of size limits for WA dhufish, baldchin groper and breaksea cod to limit barotrauma.
- A maximum of one bait or lure per line can be used when fishing from a boat for demersal scalefish.
- Implementation of Abrolhos Islands wilderness fishing:
  - reduced bag limit of 1 demersal finfish;
  - o reduced bag limit of 1 large pelagic finfish;
  - o reduced finfish possession limit of 5 kgs of fillets or 1 day's bag limit of whole fish
- Shifting the timing of the Abrolhos Islands baldchin groper spawning closure to be 1 October to 31 December (inclusive).

#### WEST COAST DEMERSAL REVIEW CONTINUES

• Extending the timing of the Cockburn and Warnbro Sounds pink snapper spawning closure to be 1 August to 31 January (inclusive).

It is important to understand the current recreational fishing rules will remain in place when recreational fishing for demersal scalefish in the West Coast Bioregion reopens on 16 December until 31 January 2023.
