GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

I am looking forward to increased activity at the Club as we approach the Easter long weekend, commencement of the school holidays and importantly, demersal fishing is open during the school holidays. Please refer to the links below for further details.

Our Club is unique with our core membership of trailer boat owners using our ramp facilities on a casual basis and the remaining boat owners, storing their boats in hardstand bays or in a pen at the Club. Whilst our membership numbers are down on the previous year, the Club is trading well and financially strong and can continue to improve and add new facilities including the Pens Stage 3 Development which is currently being reviewed.

The Pens Stage 3 Development includes new pens, a new rock seawall, improvements and access to the washdown bays, additional car bays and a new landscaped area near the pens. Subject to approvals, we are planning to commence Stage 3 of the Pen Development in September 2023 with completion in January/February 2024.

We are currently preparing the Club Budget for 2023-24 and are very conscious of keeping membership subscription cost increases as low as possible following last year's increase due to inflation and an increase in our lease cost.

I am very happy to report that the Club's decision to have the three yearly market rent review for our lease determined by an independent valuer, was successful with the valuer's award consistent with our assessment of market rent. This decision has resulted in a substantial saving for the Club.

We are also introducing winter temporary hardstand storage during our quieter months from May to October. These bays are available on a prepaid monthly basis and members taking advantage of this offer will be given one months free accommodation. Please call the office to register or to obtain additional information.

Our social media campaign has been successful although our membership numbers are still less than the previous year. We are considering repeating the campaign next season including holding a "bigger and better" Open Day leading into summer with attractions and activities for both existing members and potential new members. Further details to follow.

Our staff team has settled following a number of changes and I look forward to a stable team moving forward with a lot of positive improvements at the Club.

I look forward to discussing any suggestions from members to improve our unique Club.



TREASURER'S REPORT

Our Club continues to remain in a strong financial position. We currently are just shy of \$400k in bank deposits and our loan facility of \$520k has only a minimal \$3.8k drawdown. Our financial result to date provides a surplus of \$103k with a budget shortfall of \$17k. February's notable variances are:

Positive contribution:

·Salaries/wages	\$2k below budget
·Interest on loan	\$3k below budget
·Rent	\$2k below budget
•Depreciation	\$5k below budget

Negative contributions:

·Pen Fees	\$10k below budget
•Marketing & advertising	\$5k above budget

Our major capital expenditure project - Stage 3 of the Pen Development, along with beautifying/ bituminising down at the ramps has been delayed due to planning approvals and the price rises associated with this project. March/April is the time of year where your Management Committee sits down and considers a budget for the coming financial year. The final approved budget will determine our Club's capital expenditure program, repairs/maintenance, wages and what's on the wish list.

The Committee is aware of the proposed increases in our land and seabed leases and consumer price index figures and will consider all these factors before finalizing the budget. The Committee is always committed to delivering membership value and will be looking at keeping fees and charges as low as possible whilst maintaining the effective operation of the Club and continued improvement and maintenance of our facilities.

This is a great opportunity for members to let the Committee or General Manager, John Tissott know of any items, projects or work that needs to be considered at the budget discussions.

The West Coast demersal ban will be lifted 1st April. So good luck and tight lines for those of you heading out targeting some tasty fillets.





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WESTPORT & COCKBURN SOUND HARBOUR UPDATE

Update on WAMSI's Recreational Fishing Survey

Recently, I met with Matt Navaro and two of his research team at UWA who kindly agreed to give me a progress report on the recreational fishing survey.

Sampling started in early January 2023 and will continue until the end of April. The surveying is done at 8 boat ramps in Cockburn Sound. By the end of February about 150 surveys had been completed, but the target is at least 400. In addition, they have started shore surveys.

A few fishers have refused to participate and those that have refused usually say it is due to a lack of time.

The results have not yet been fully analysed but their general impression is that most people lack detailed knowledge about Westport. Participants have expressed concern about the impact of Westport on:

- 1. Pollution
- 2. Dredging
- 3. Ship activity
- 4. Access points to the water

The sentiment towards Westport covers the spectrum of supportive, unsure, neutral and against. An interesting preliminary finding is that while they value the Sound, many fishers and boaters appear to be using it only to transit to offshore areas so are not so

concerned about its condition.

The team will produce an Interim Report in June and a final report in September.

I was delighted to be elected as a committee member at the last AGM, having been a member of the club since 2017. I have been given the Fire, Safety and Environmental portfolios as part of my Club duties, which I hope I can improve, bringing the Club more up to date with issues that may make us more environmentally friendly.
